ECCLU 2012 was the second edition devoted to "What's new in hemato-oncology?".

ECCLU was well attended with one hundred and four participants from 26 countries registered to the event.

The efficacious format of the previous edition was maintained and again proved to be successful and the two keynote lectures were well received. The participants actively took part with many questions and with good presentations of interesting cases.

Considering the program, the experience with devoting 1/3 of the time to lymphomas (taking advantage also of the presence of the members of the International Extranodal Lymphoma Study Group, IELSG, which had their annual meeting in Lugano the day before), 1/3 to leukemias and myeloproliferative disease and 1/3 to myeloma was very well accepted by the attendees. Overall the participants' evaluation was very favorable.

ESO is therefore considering to repeat a course on *What is New in Haemato-Oncology?* in the future, perhaps every third year, instead of every second year, to address numerous and more relevant advances in the field and consequently, attract a larger audience.
